*Precise tracing, cutting, and piecing are the secrets to making Cindy Mccoy's stunning **Dragon Tails** table topper. But, don't worry. If you've never pieced oddly shaped pieces, just refer to the Quilting Tutorials group.*

Requiring only 4 fabrics, this project is also a great way to experiment with color. Make the tail from three analogous colors or try a triadic color scheme. Throw in a neutral for the background and you're ready to go.

*Don't limit yourself to just this color scheme which emphasizes the tails. The star within a hexagon design lends itself to many other presentations as well! A blank **Dragon Tails** template is included. Get out those colored pencils and have fun designing your own!*

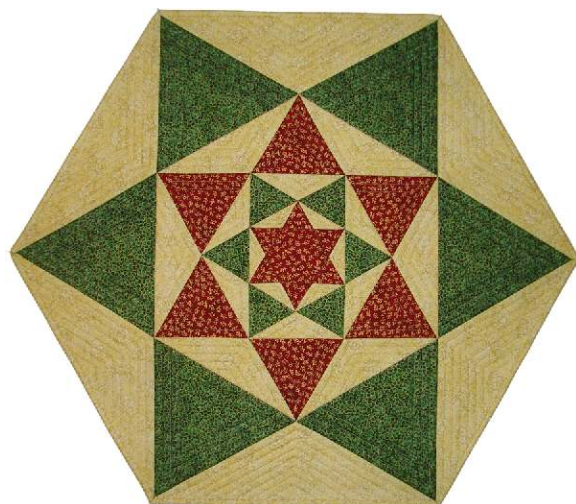
Materials

All cuts based on usable 40" wide, prewashed 100% cotton fabrics

- 5/8 yd color #1 - background
- 1/2 yd color #2 - tail spikes
- 5/8 yd color #3 - medium for tail and center hexagon
- 1/2 yd color #4 - dark for tail
- 1-1/4 yd for backing
- 3/8 yd for binding
- 42" x 42" piece of batting
- 9 (nine) 8-1/2" x 11" pieces of cardstock (optional; for making templates)

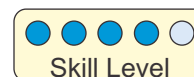
