

Serape Quilt

*When I think of a serape, I think of something that is bright and colorful in its simplicity. If there are any designs incorporated into the weave, they are usually geometric and repetitive. With these concepts in mind, my **Serape Quilt** was created.*

*Because of the repetitive blocks in the pieced rows and the strip piecing in the band rows, this quilt is a good beginner project. With simple straight-line quilting, it can be quilted on your home machine using a walking foot. So pull out your favorite palette of solid colors or tone-on-tone prints and make a **Serape Quilt** of your own.*

Materials List: Fabric is based on 42" of usable fabric. If usable fabric width is less, you may need to purchase additional yardage and cut more strips.

- 1-1/2 yds red fabric
- 1-1/2 yds blue fabric
- 1-1/4 yds cream fabric
- 5/8 yd yellow fabric
- 5/8 yd green fabric
- 2/3 yd black fabric
- 5/8 yd fabric for binding
- 3-5/8 yds fabric for backing
- 63" x 83" piece of batting or twin size

You will also need: Basic sewing supplies, neutral thread for piecing, neutral or matching thread for quilting and a walking or even feed foot for machine quilting.

Special Directions

For this pattern, the fabric strips for the individual blocks will be cut as they are being made. You may be able to cut some of the smaller units for the blocks from the remainder of the larger cuts. Always cut the largest pieces first.

All seams are sewn right sides together with a 1/4" seam. Test your block size and adjust to a scant 1/4" seam if necessary.

Press the seam allowances in the direction of the arrows.
