Introduction

Harlequin (adjective): in varied colors, many hued, rainbow like . . .

The name **Harlequin** comes from the use of many different colors of fabrics pulled from my stash of solid yardage and scraps remaining from other projects. For example, the color blue appears five different times in the quilt, but each blue is a slightly different hue since it was made from a different piece of blue fabric. Even the white tone-on-tone fabrics are different since I did not have enough yardage left from the scraps I had used earlier.

Materials List

All fabric cuts based on usable 40" wide, prewashed 100% cotton

The fabric amounts listed are the amount needed to make the whole top using just one solid/print for each color. If you would like to make your version more varied in color, more harlequin-like, the amount of fabric for each section is listed with each round.

- 2-3/4 yds white fabric
- 4 yds blue fabric
- 1/4 yd light blue fabric (Flying Geese border, Step 4)
- 7/8 yd pink fabric
- 1-1/4 yds green fabric
- 1-3/8 yds yellow fabric
- 1-1/8 yds purple fabric
- 7/8 yd red fabric
- 1/4 yd orange fabric (Flying Geese border, Step 4)
- 3/4 yd fabric for binding
- 2-3/4 yds of extra-wide (103"-108") fabric for backing
- 97" x 97" piece of batting
- 12 pieces of lightweight paper for foundation paper-piecing (Step 2)
- Small square up rulers (2-1/2", 3-1/2", and 6-1/2")
- Large ruler(s) to square up a 24-1/2" block (Step 1)
- 6" Add-A-Quarter™ ruler (optional, Step 2)
- Flying Geese 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" trimming ruler (optional, Step 3)
