Fabric Requirements

Finished size: 54-1/2" x 54-1/2"

All cuts based on usable 40" wide, prewashed 100% cotton fabrics

- 1-3/4 yds Fabric A (white)
- 1-1/2 yds Fabric B (green)
- 2-5/8 yds Fabric C (red)
- 1 yd Fabric D (yellow)
- 5/8 yd for binding
- 2-7/8 yds for backing
- 60" x 60" piece of batting
- Lightweight foundation paper
- 5" x 8" index card
- 12 plastic bags or other labeling system for sorting units
